

Less Commonly Taught Languages in the CIC Universities – Opportunity for Deeper Collaboration

Together, CIC universities teach 109 less commonly taught languages, direct 44 Title VI funded National Resources Centers in Area Studies (Area Studies Centers), and support seven Title VI-funded National Resource Centers in Language Studies (Language Resource Centers). In 2007, CIC universities received \$9,496,204 to support the Area Study Centers (33% of all Title VI dollars awarded) and \$2,234,000 for the Language Resource Centers (47% of all Title VI dollars awarded).

While CIC universities have experimented with collaboration in the delivery of languages since the early 1960s, and our recent experimentation in sharing languages through CourseShare¹ and the Traveling Scholar Program suggest that there is increasing interest in collaboration as a tool to enhance access to language offerings across the consortium. Further, recent reports from the Modern Language Association² and from the National Research Council of the National Academies³ lend a sense of focus and urgency to these issues.

The CIC Deans of Arts & Sciences and the CIC Deans & Directors of International Programs seek to increase collaboration among their colleges and associated programs in ways that will increase access to less commonly taught languages for students from across the member universities and will enhance and strengthen the related academic and area studies programs.

Key goals of the collaboration include:

- Use and enhance existing CIC programs such as CourseShare, AESOP (study abroad), the Traveling Scholar Program, and the Foreign Language Enhancement Program (FLEP) to provide access to language course offerings across the CIC.
- Encourage select area studies centers, language resource centers, and summer language institutes to leverage resources, strengthen their programs, and increase enrollments in language offerings.
- Support the development and test the efficacy of innovative strategies for teaching and learning languages, including the application of new technologies and linkages to study abroad programs.

Specific outcomes of such collaboration might include:

- Increase the numbers of language offerings available to students on every CIC campus (e.g. every student will have access to 10% more offerings through collaboration than would otherwise be available locally).
- Development of a large-scale, grant-funded activity to utilize new and emerging technologies to enhance the language teaching and learning experience (development and submission of one faculty-led grant proposal involving faculty from several CIC universities).
- Coordination of select Title VI programs and offerings to deepen and broaden the programs and to increase their effectiveness.

Strategies to accomplish the outcomes might include:

- Actively promote CourseShare, AESOP (study abroad), the Traveling Scholar Program, and the Foreign Language Enhancement Program (FLEP) to department chairs, faculty, advisors, and students
- Facilitate collaborative discussions among East Asian Studies Centers
- Host CICme site for exchange of ideas and projects related to the utilization of new and emerging technologies that enhance the language teaching and learning experience
- Invite foundation representatives to the spring meeting of the Arts & Sciences Deans
- Review of other collaborative language efforts across the country for consideration of possible models
- Explore a pilot project for coordination of proficiency testing

External Collaborations to Consider

The National Research Council recently produced a report titled International Education and Foreign Languages: Keys to Securing America's Future. The report included 12 recommendations, including the following that might be interesting to build upon:

1. Recommendation 4.1. The Department of Education should increase incentives in the application process for National Resource Centers and Language Resource Centers to collaborate with schools or colleges of education on their campuses in the development of curriculum, the design of instructional materials, and teacher education.
2. Recommendation 12.3. The federal government should contract for a new National Foreign Language Assessment and Technology Project. The initial focus of the project should be on the research and development needed to design and implement a range of new technology-based methods for (1) assessing language proficiency and (2) supporting new language instruction through the development of common platforms.

Additionally, the CIC should connect with such foundations as Mellon and Sloan, and with the U.S. Department of Education in support of the aims of this initiative.
