91,925 international students were enrolled in CIC schools in Fall 2013.<sup>1</sup>



- The Top 5 Programs of Study were engineering, business, social sciences, mathematics & statistics, and computer & information sciences.
- The most international students **originated from China, India,** and **South Korea,** making up over 65% of the total studying at CIC schools.
- About 12% of enrolled international graduate students were on Optional Practical Training (OPT),
  meaning they were authorized for temporary employment authorization that relates to the student's field
  of study. OPT employment authorization is typically granted for 12 months after the completion of a
  degree.


#### **Enrolled International Students** at CIC Schools in Fall 2013

- The University of Minnesota, the University of Maryland, Michigan State University, Pennsylvania State University, and Purdue University had the greatest number of countries represented.




## **Enrolled International Students** at CIC Schools in Fall 2013
